

Re: Proposed Westcastle Four Seasons Report - Rare Plants

In the Fall 1991 issue of *Iris*, Dave Shepard reported the tentative identification of *Viola macloskeyi* in the proposed development area. Due to uncertainty of identification we requested that Dr. John Packer examine several specimens, who confirmed the violet as being the common *Viola palustris*.

To date, the number of rare plants (according to Packer and Bradley 1984) found in the area is four, which are listed as follows:

Common Name	Scientific Name	Distribution
1) Bear grass	<i>Xerophyllum tenax</i>	Widespread in pine forest from valley bottom to above treeline.
2) Large flowered ragwort	<i>Senecio megacephalus</i>	Sparse above treeline.
3) Mountain box	<i>Pachystima myrsinites</i>	Widespread in pine forest from valley bottom to treeline.
4) Red twinberry	<i>Lonicera utahensis</i>	Occasional in pine forest and clearings.

According to Packer and Bradley (1984), in Alberta these species are wholly restricted to the extreme southwestern part of the province especially Waterton Lakes National Park, but are not infrequent within it. These species are also found in southern British Columbia, and nearby states including Montana, Idaho, Utah and south to California.

I would appreciate your adding this clarification to the next issue of *Iris*.

NATIVE SEED CATALOGUE - SOURCES AND SUPPLIERS

The following is a list of companies and organizations where native seed or plants might be obtained. This list should not be considered complete. Anyone knowing of companies which should be included, or information which should be altered, please contact the ANPC or Dana Bush 282-3975.

All plants listed here are considered native to Alberta by John Packer in:
Flora of Alberta E.H. Moss. 2nd Edition 1983, John Packer. Univ. of Toronto Press.

Native plants used for reclamation should be chosen on a regional basis only. Species should not only be native to the specific site, but the original plant material should be collected in the same bio-geo-climatic region. Eg. Reclamation projects around Edmonton should use species native to and collected from the Aspen Parkland around Edmonton. Lethbridge projects should specify plants native to and collected from the mixed grass prairie in southern Alberta. Please use a local grower and specify local plant material.

Growers and Reclamation specialists have a responsibility to use material which has been collected and propagated in an ethical manner. Check to ensure that trees, shrubs and perennials have been propagated, not wild dug.
